Statistically, four out of five car seats are installed incorrectly. In this area, and nationwide, the most common car seat misuse is not getting the seat tight enough in the vehicle. Other misuses include a loose harness, not routing the harness correctly and improperly using the seat belt or lower anchors.

Each Tuesday and Thursday, Safe Kids Fargo/Moorhead conducts Car Seat Check Up Events at the Sanford Children's Seat Safety Center (601 39th St. N. Fargo). Trained technicians teach parents, grandparents and caregivers how to use and install their car seats correctly. You may bring your child with you if desired, and we can fit the seat to them properly.

Parent/ child activity: Social conflict can arise daily in your child's life, but he/she is not born with the skills to know how to express themselves in these situations. You can model appropriate dialogue and conflict resolution techniques to help him/her get through social issues such as sharing and making friends. Watch your child, see how your child deals with frustration or anger in social situations, and support his/her learning by helping him /her think of how he/she can Express his/her emotions appropriately. I see you are upset that John knocked down your castle. Say this to him/her: " I don't like that you knocked down my castle." Use expression in your voice and face as you model the correct behavior. Encourage your child to match your tone of voice and repeat you. With practice your child will be comfortable to express their feelings in the right way.
